Frank Taylor Jerry Archer I was not able to worship with my GOPCC family, because Patti and I attended a wedding in Kansas City. We traveled through a hail storm with gusts of wind almost tipping over our van; and the rain was coming down so hard that we could not see in front of us. It was a little frightening.

It was beautiful wedding. This wedding had some wonderful nuances. Perhaps I can suggest some of these things to people who want to get married at our church. It was neat to see the groom escort his parents down the aisle to their seats. The Flower Girl, rather than spread flower petals on the floor, gave flowers to the people sitting along the center aisle. The traditional vows were rearranged just a little differently and gave greater attention to the promise of honoring, respecting, and loving each other. I liked that emphasis. I plan to include that vow with my list of others, which I share with couples in choosing vows for their wedding. The vows went something like this:

I, (name), take you, (name), to be my wedded wife/husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, whether we are rich or poor, sick or healthy, I will honor you, and respect you (I'm going to add "love you" to this part as well), as long as we both shall live.

It is a subtle change, but it draws our attention to the fact that, no matter what, marriage is based on offering respect, honor and love in every circumstance. We do not bad mouth and make rude or cruel comments to our spouse, or say such things in front of our children or to our friends or in any other social setting. Honor and respect enriches the soil in which love can grow deep roots in a marital relationship. No matter what the atmospheric conditions are, honor, respect, and love will keep a marital relationship alive and thriving.

This reminds me that the Marriage Enrichment group is hosting a "Friday Nights at the Movies" June 12th. It will be shown at dusk and weather permitting, we will show it in the parking lot of our church. If it is raining or too cold or windy, we will show the movie inside. The movie title is, Fireproof. All are welcome to come.

The ceremony concluded with a surprise visit of a Scottish man playing his bagpipes - of course the priest knew and the organist knew and the bride knew about this surprise (you never pull a surprise like that without the permission of the bride).

I noticed at the wedding ceremony and the reception some people holding a portrait size picture of a man and a woman posted to a piece of Styrofoam and attached to giant popsicle sticks. Every once in a while someone would take a picture of the people holding these portraits. I asked what that was all about. I was told that the gentleman was suffering from cancer and was too ill and weak to attend these celebrations. So, friends made up these pictureportraits as a way to say that they are with the families in spirit at these celebrations. Pictures were taken to show that they were there; and later the friends will show them the pictures having a good time at these celebrations. (cont.)
