"From the Pastor"



This month is Stewardship month. In past weeks I talked a little about what is stewardship in general and about planned giving and giving beyond living – the gift that keeps on giving. This Sunday is Consecration Sunday. We are inviting you to this Sunday service as we consecrate our financial pledges and our selves to the mission plan for 2010. And we ask you to join us in a celebration dinner – a "Giving Thanks" Dinner. While several people will be making the main course of our dinner, we are asking you to bring a dessert to share.

Also, as you are praying about your pledge amount, I want to share with you a word about "Tithing." Tithing is a voluntary, systematic contribution of financial support to our church. It is voluntary because it is giving out of love and gratitude for all God gives us. It is systematic because we are giving a predetermined portion of our income as we receive it. The Old Testament guideline for tithing is ten percent of total property. And the tithing tradition still remains an important part of church life. Tithing symbolizes and helps express our commitment to Christ and Christ's church. Through such giving we offer ourselves in service and devotion to God. We become stronger in faith, more aware of other's needs, and we experience the joy of sharing with others in Christ. Tithing is reliable funding which allows the church to plan for expenses, carry out programs, maintain outreach activities and helps those in need. How do you know what to pledge? A good example is to set aside a percentage of our income. The Bible denotes a tithe as ten percent. But we also know that this may be difficult for some or many of us. I encourage you to look at what percentage you gave last year and pray about increasing it a percentage point or so for 2010. Stewardship and tithing, for me, is about trusting in God. Can I trust God will take care of my needs as I give away what I think is going to save me from poverty? Stewardship and tithing is about becoming aware of the sin of greed and selfishness that "so easily entangles" me and imprisons me to a life of anxious selfconcern. Stewardship and tithing, for me, is a call to exercise the giving of myself beyond my "self" and learning to live more freely and trustingly in the loving care of a caring and loving God shown to us through Jesus Christ; and shown to us by experiencing the daily blessings of God. This is not an easy thing for me and I am sure that it is not an easy thing for many of you. But let us join together Sunday to pray for each other and to encourage one another to grow in faith by consecrating ourselves and our financial resources to our Lord and Savior. Congregational Meeting Report Nov. 1, 2009

We had 78 members in attendance at the meeting. Upon Anna opening the meeting, we reviewed the slate of officers. Lisa Ybarbo stepped forward to fill the Christian Education nomination and Frank Lakins & Brian Parrett have accepted the Endowment nominations for the next three years. The Board Vice Chair and Finance/Stewardship Comm. Chair positions still remain open. Anna gave a description of each and asked the congregation to pray for God to lead the right persons to us to fill them. Anna made a correction regarding the Financial secretary's position, Jo Anne has 1 yr. remaining of a two year term. Susan Beall made the motion to accept the slate of officers for 2010, as corrected. Frank Lakins seconded the

motion. The motion was approved.

Frank Lakins, Finance Chairperson, explained the proposed budget. He shared that the staff, in their concern for the church budget and expenses, requested to hold their salaries the same. There are no salary increases. The Committee looked at making decreases where they could with as little negative impact as possible. They reduced the budget by 1.7%, down to \$190,300. Tom Wheeler moved to accept the proposed 2010 budget as presented. Greg Goodner seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Frank also shared about the "Mission Book" and "Giving Thanks Dinner" plans. Frank expressed his heartfelt feelings about the Holy Spirit working through us here at Greenmont Church. We can see what God is accomplishing here as we serve Him. Frank asks us to stay strong in our faith. Let the Holy Spirit move you to make a commitment to pledge. Do not be afraid to pledge a portion back to the Lord. Pledge cards were handed out to those in attendance and mailed to those not in attendance. Pray about how we can support our church, and turn in your pledge card next Sunday, Nov. 22 at our consecration service. Then join in the "Giving Thanks Dinner" following the service.
