From the Pastor

Very often people will walk into the office, looking for Ascension Catholic Church. Because we and our good neighbors are so close to each other, we are often confused in identity to be our neighbor. Locally we are not identified as GOPCC, but as the church "Next to Ascension." That's why I suggested that we erect a huge symbol to identify ourselves as a congregation and a denomination separate from our neighbors.

However, when I first started speaking about the Red Comma as a religious symbol of the UCC, I was met with blank stares. Many members of GOPCC did not know what the comma represents. Therefore, let me take a step back and explain a little more about the Comma.

Grace Ethel Cecile Rosalie Allen, an American comedian, actress, singer and dancer was the one who said: "Never place a period where God has placed a comma." That quote became the slogan of the "God is Still Speaking Campaign" of the United Church of Christ (UCC.) The Comma is now becoming the branding symbol of the UCC. The branding symbol is not to be confused with the official logo of the UCC.

Our denomination has a problem with our very long name. We do not have a brand name like the Presbyterians, Baptists or Methodist's do. We are called UCC'ers. That's an odd name! So, when the Comma was introduced, people immediately caught on and started calling the UCC the "Comma Church." That's the reason why I suggested that we place a huge red Comma on the pumpkin patch.

I hope that someone will hear my cry in the dessert!
